STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE James Stickle moved to Addison from New Jersey and built on this prominent site around 1800. The farm was left to his son Charles Stickle in 1847 and within 10 years he had built a small 1 1/2 story front on his father's leanto.



The site is interesting for its range of functional out buildings. Particularly noteworthy is the Blacksmith shop which is listed in Beers Atlas (1871) as entirely separate from the main complex.

The farm maintains a sense of the original self-sufficient complex.

DESCRIPTION: Mixed saltbox and Greek Revival cottage The newer Greek Revival front was built perpendicular to the original saltbox. The saltbox measures approximately 27' X 24'. While its original character is obliterated by misuse, aluminum siding and the added structure, its proportions, fenestration and roof line give clear evidence of its original appearance (See 0101-52 for discussion of the Addison saltbox type). The wide entablature and gable returns of the 5 X 2 bay 1 1/2 story Greek Revival front indicate that under the layers of aluminum is a good example of early Greek Revival cottage architecture. Some of the window sashes are original and all of the slate on both roofs, but it is amazing to what extent aluminum siding has destroyed the integrity of the house. Noteworthy are the

DESCRIPTION: This outbuilding has undergone significant alteration since its original braced frame was constructed in the early 19th century. It originally stood about 300 yards southeast of its present location. It was moved to its present site around 1890, resided and converted to a workshop storage shed. The blacksmith shop is clearly listed as separate from the house in Beer's Atlas (1871)
