PLEASE NOTE CAREFULLY:

The site numbers on the maps and lists of historic properties in the published town history following this page **DO NOT** correspond to the Vermont Historic Sites and Structures Survey (VHSS) numbers on the individual survey forms in this town survey.

The Vermont Division for Historic Preservation conducted a resurvey of all historic properties in each town in Addison County in preparation for the publication of a county history in 1992. New historic sites were added to the VHSS, but a new VHSS survey form was not filled out for each new site, as the information was entered directly into a computer database. Therefore not all sites in the published history have a corresponding VHSS form.



For the town history publication all historic sites, from both the original survey and the resurvey, were assigned new numbers for the published maps and lists. The new numbering system for the publication starts in the upper left hand (NW) corner of each town and proceeds sequentially from left to right, top to bottom, or clockwise around the map. For those towns in which further surveying was done after the initial publication map numbering was completed, there may be some scattered map numbers that are out of sequence.

To see if a property in the published history also has a VHSS form, compare the maps in the published history with the VHSS maps. If the location you are interested in has a number marked on both maps, the building has a VHSS form.

Most of the photographs are contemporary to show the historic structures as they stand today. 

BRIDPORT

The first white settlers came to the town of Bridport, which lies between Lake Champlain and the southern foothills of Snake Mountain in Addison County, beginning in the 1770s. Bridport village developed after 1790 at the intersection of the Whitehall to Vergennes stage road (now VT Route 22A), a road to the lake, and a road to Middlebury (now VT Route 125). Farmers soon shipped potash, grain, and livestock from several ferries along the lake, and the hamlet of West Bridport evolved around one ferry to Crown Point, New York. By 1830 many farmers raised sheep for wool, but by mid-century most found stockbreeding more profitable. Around 1900 many farmers shifted to dairying, which continues to be the focus of the town economy today. Several camps along the lakeshore comprise the extent of more recent development, and Bridport retains the aura of a nineteenth century agricultural community.

THE CROWN POINT MILITARY ROAD was cut through Bridport in 1759, and although the town was chartered the following year, permanent residents did not arrive until after the American Revolution. By the late 1780s the Whitehall to Vergennes stage road

was completed through the town. Between 1791 and 1810 the population of Bridport tripled from 449 to 1,520.

Among those who arrived during these years were the Hamilton family, who in 1795 began clearing farmland along the road to Middlebury. James Hamilton built a simple, Cape Cod type house (ell on 64) in that year, while John, his brother, waited until 1804 to build a similar house (65) nearby. In western Bridport, Solomon Lapham chose a prominent rise with a sweeping view of Lake Champlain as the setting for his large, Federal style house (117, c.1800). Twelve-over-twelve-pane windows, small gable returns, and narrow entrance pilasters indicate the early date of his house.

Potash, produced from the ashes of trees felled to make way for farms, was the first commodity manufactured in Bridport. Samuel Buck pioneered the potash industry in town, beginning around 1790. The industry thrived, and Buck had a grand house (29) built in 1803 along the stage road to Vergennes. With its graceful Palladian window and Federal style entrance, this house exhibits a degree of

early architectural refinement rare in Bridport. Other Federal style houses of this period were fitted with details ranging from a simple entrance entablature and panelled door (10, c.1810) to entries with pilasters and sidelights (84, c.1810).

After the completion of the Champlain Canal and enactment of the 1824 national wool tariff, many Bridport farmers took advantage of new markets and high wool prices by raising sheep on a large scale. On some farms (66, 98) barns built to shelter flocks during the winter still remain. Many farmers were able to afford new houses as well. One, a son of William Braisted who came to Bridport in 1786, had a new Greek Revival style house (106) erected on the family sheep farm around 1840.

The general prosperity of the wool-growing years is illustrated by the many stylish homes constructed in Bridport between 1820 and 1840. While most farmers had frame houses built, a few opted for more expensive brick. A member of the Pratt family had a stately brick home (58, c.1828) built in the late-Federal style. A semi-circular, entrance fanlight set above pilasters ornamented by starbursts graces this house. Hiram Smith's Greek Revival style house (1, c.1835) is noteworthy for its impressive, modillion cornice and muntin-interlaced gable window. The bricks for this house may have been fired on the farm, which Smith's grandfather established in 1770. Another house (78, c.1845) is an interesting variation of the Greek Revival style with its pavilion with ells plan, panelled corner pilasters, and elaborate entrance entablature.

Bridport village, laid out in 1784, developed slowly at the intersection of the stage road to Vergennes and one of three main routes to the lake. The Congregational

church was organized in 1790 and met in one of the first structures (ell on A32, 1794/1810) in the village, on the south side of the green. The Fair Haven to Vergennes turnpike was finished through the village in 1814, following the old stage road. A tavern (86, c.1818) was constructed just south of the intersection, a convenient stop for traffic to and from the ferries. In 1819 John Brainard opened a large tavern (A12) just north of the intersection.

With the rise in canal-bound traffic, trade in the village increased significantly. Merchant Paris Fletcher had a Federal style brick store (A26, 1826) built which resembled brick structures in Woodstock, from where he had emigrated in 1810. At about the same time Fletcher constructed an ornate Federal style addition to the front of his home (A25, c.1825). With its monumental portico, full entablature, and semi-circular entrance fan, this house reflected Fletcher's stature as a successful merchant. In 1826 another merchant, Matthew Chambers, also added a Federal style front to his older, saltbox type house (A33). Both Chambers' and Fletcher's homes bear pediments filled with flushboard above enriched Doric entablatures. By 1845

three Greek Revival style houses (A29, A34, A31) had been constructed around the green. Merchant Luther Ferre had his house (A29, c.1840) built just south of his store, while the Congregational church had another house (A34, c.1840) built as a parsonage.

FERRIES OPERATED along the lakeshore in Bridport as early as 1811, and several roads soon linked them with the Fair Haven Turnpike, completed through town by 1814. Just north of the intersection of the turnpike and the market road between Middlebury and the Bridport ferry to Port Franklin, Benjamin Skiff provided refreshment until 1825 in his small tavern (wing on 32a). By 1830 commercial activity around the ferry to Crown Point village surpassed that of the ferry to Port Franklin, and West Bridport was born. By the mid-1840s this hamlet boasted several houses, a store, a brick schoolhouse (111, 1837), and a steamboat landing. In 1847 Joel Frost, proprietor of the ferry, had a Greek Revival style house (112) built above the landing. Subsequent ferry operators also lived there.

After the national tariff repeal in 1846, wool prices declined considerably, and many farmers in town made an easy transition to breeding sheep for Western wool growers. In 1862 H. C. Burwell began breeding Spanish Merino sheep. His farm (23), with its bank barn and other stock barns, is a typical example of a later nineteenth century sheep-breeding complex. Although most Bridport sheep breeders favored Merinos, Waterman Hinds bred Atwood sheep on his farm (45), while Orra Gibbs was noted for the Cotswolds on his farm (21).

Bridport residents also became well-known for the horses raised on their farms. David E. Hill purchased the Morgan stallion Black Hawk in 1843 and bred him over the next thirteen years to local mares, producing high-quality offspring. Ira D. Fletcher rented



After the Civil War, many Vermont farmers who remodeled or constructed new homes did so using Italianate style forms and decoration. Two-story, cube-shaped, hipped-roof houses, large enough for a farm family and help, were popular in both Bridport and Addison, and in many ways presaged the popular Four-square house form of the twentieth century. This example (15a, c.1880) has an attached kitchen ell and Italianate style porches, cornice brackets, and corner pilasters.

Black Hawk's stud services, and a beam in his horse barn (26a, c.1850) still bears "Black Hawk's Pen" in faded paint. During the 1850s Bridport breeders demonstrated the fleetness of their horses on a small racetrack between H. C. Hathorn's farm (9) and a farm (16) owned by Sheldon Smith. By 1880, Matthew K. Barbour was just one resident breeding "Black Hawk horses" on his farm (50), while Henry F. Hall bred Hambletonian horses on the farm (57) his grandfather established in 1790.

Many Bridport farmers reaped handsome profits from the sale of their livestock (H. C. Burwell was offered \$3,500 for a merino ram in 1876), and as they prospered, they had new homes built. They preferred the fashionable Italianate style, characterized by a hipped roof, cube shape, and scrolled cornice brackets. Merino breeder Henry E. Merrill's c.1870 house (107a) is an exceptionally ornate example of this style with its elaborate brackets, distinctive lintel boards over the windows, and square belvedere on the roof.

Stock breeders also carried the detail lavished on their dwellings to the barns built to shelter their prize animals, most commonly ornamenting the barns with cupolas, such as one (47a, c.1885) on Julius J. Crane's farm. Around 1880 sheep breeder Robert W. Hemenway, descendent of early settler Asa Hemenway, had an ornate barn (72a) with cupola and brackets built for his livestock. Most farmers tended toward more modest barns, however. Thurman Bailey was one of a few farmers in Bridport who bred dairy cattle, first Alderneys, then Jerseys, and his large, unadorned, c.1870 bank barn (2b) is one outstanding example of this barn type in town.



A fire in February, 1891, destroyed the 1821 Bridport Methodist Church, which also served the local Masonic society. The same year both groups built new Queen Anne style structures. The Masonic Hall (A9), with its distinctive corner belfry tower, was designed by Vergennes architect Charles LeBoeuf. The Methodist church (A10), which has had its original interior corner tower removed, was designed by Middlebury architect Clinton Smith.

Although the population of Bridport declined to 1,018 in 1890, Bridport village, as the center of a successful agricultural town, experienced a spurt of growth, when three new buildings were erected on the north side of the green in 1891. A Masonic Hall (A9) and a new vestry (A6) for the Congregational church went up, as well as a new Methodist church (A10). Both the Masonic Hall and Methodist Church exhibit characteristics of the Queen Anne style: the hall with its shingled, pent gable and asymmetrical tower, and the church with its shingling and divided stained-glass windows.

During the last years of the century, some Bridport farmers turned increasingly to dairying. The Nichols family was known during this period for its cheese and butter, the first dairy products that Bridport families shipped to distant markets. During the 1880s John D. Nichols built a small "cheese house" (9d) on his farm. With its stove, churns, and presses still intact today, the structure serves as a reminder of this phase of the dairy industry. Later, Edward Nichols had a larger creamery and cheese manufactory (11a, c.1900) built on his neighboring farm.

DURING THE FIRST QUARTER of the new century, farmers became committed to dairying and many had modern barns built to accommodate their growing herds. These huge, gambrel-roofed barns replaced or were simply attached to their gable-roofed predecessors. Stephen Cooke, Sr., had a new


barn constructed (26c, 1938), while Daniel Huestis added on to an older structure (3a, c.1885/1935). Flared eaves and decorated metal ventilators distinguish the Cooke barn (26c). Other early twentieth century development included the 1919 establishment by the Bridport Cooperative Dairy Company of a cheese factory in a Federal style house (30, c.1820) near the village, and the construction of a new Grange Hall (A19) in 1932.

Beginning just prior to World War II, a number of residents constructed modest summer camps along the lakeshore. The most unusual of these is a converted trolley car (113) that Ervin Huestis, the last ferry operator, floated across the lake from Crown Point in the 1930s. Apparently he stayed in it when foul weather delayed the running of the ferry. Also at the ferry landing in West Bridport is a more typical frame camp (114, c.1940). It was built inside the foundation of a large, nineteenth century icehouse, where ice cut from the lake in winter was stored and sold throughout the year, probably by the owner of the ferry and store there.

Since World War II Bridport has remained predominantly a farming community. The village, with its stately Federal and Greek Revival style homes surrounding the green, is listed as a historic district in the State Register of Historic Places. The preservation of Paris Fletcher's village home by the Bridport Historical Society, and the well-kept outlying farmhouses and barns attest to the pride local residents have in their architectural legacy. Today the rolling fields, handsome farm and village houses, and stately barns of Bridport continue to attest to the successes of its residents and the strength of its heritage.





GLOSSARY

Note: all terms are defined as they are used in this publication. They may have other meanings not included here.

bank barn A barn whose basement is built into the side of a hill or earthen bank and whose first floor stable is at grade level.

bargeboard Decorative board, often scroll sawn or carved, ornamenting rooflines.

bay Regular vertical divisions of the exterior of a building, usually defined by the door and window openings.

belvedere Rooftop structure, usually with windows on all sides.

board and batten Exterior siding of flush, wide, vertical planks with narrow wooden strips (battens) covering the joints.

c. or **circa** Used before a date to indicate that the date is approximate.



Cape Cod A 1 1/2 story house, five bays wide across the eaves side, with a central entry, eaves with little or no overhang, and originally built with a large central chimney.



Classic Cottage A 1 1/2 story house, five bays wide across the eaves side, with a central entry, characterized by a *kneewall*, and originally built with stove chimneys, usually symmetrically placed, on the ridge line.


column A vertical support that consists of a base, shaft, and capital. In classical architecture there are five types: Doric, Tuscan, Ionic, Corinthian, and Composite.

continuous architecture A farmhouse linked to its attached barns and out-buildings.

cornice Topmost part of an *entablature*. Also a decorative band found under rooflines.

dentils A band of toothlike blocks ornamenting a *cornice*.

ell A secondary block of a building whose roof ridge runs at a right angle to that of the main block.



entablature Three-part trim consisting of an architrave, frieze, and *cornice*, and found under rooflines (full entablature) and over doors.

facade Face or wall of a building, usually referring to the front wall.

fan A semi-circular or elliptical frame usually filled with radiating wooden louvers above a door or window or in the gable ends.

fanlight A semi-circular or elliptical window, often with radiating dividers or leaded glass patterns, above a door or window or in the gable ends.

flushboard siding Horizontal boards laid flush to create smooth exterior walls.

Foursquare A 2 story tall house built in the early 1900s, nearly square in plan, with a hip roof, full width front porch, and usually a central dormer.

gable roof Pitched roof with two sloping sides that meet at a ridge (the gable being the triangular wall area formed by the roof slopes).

gambrel roof Roof with two double-pitched sloping sides meeting at a ridge.



Georgian plan A 2 or 2 1/2 story house, five bays wide across the eaves side with a room on each side of a central entryway, and two rooms deep.

Gothic wall dormer Steeply pitched dormer whose front is a continuation of the main wall.

ground level stable barn A barn that has its main floor at ground level, a hay loft above, no basement, and often a *gambrel roof*.

half plan house A *Cape Cod*, *Classic Cottage*, *Georgian plan*, or *I-house* that is three bays wide across the eaves side, with the door in the left or right bay.

highdrive A ramp, often enclosed, leading from the ground up to the main level of a barn. Most commonly found on *bank barns*.

high style Having many or all of the characteristics of a particular architectural style.

hip roof Roof with four sloping sides meeting at a point or short ridge line.



I-house A 2 or 2 1/2 story house, five bays wide across the eaves side, with a central entry, and only one room deep.

jerkinhead roof A gable roof in which the gable peaks are clipped off and inclined backward.

keystone Wedge-shaped center stone in an arch.

kneewall The area between the top of the first floor windows and the eaves of a 1 or 1 1/2 story building.

lintel A horizontal stone, brick, cast-iron, or wooden beam that spans the top of a door or window opening.

Mansard roof Roof with four double-pitched sloping sides, the lower pitch being steeper than the upper.

modillions Small scrolled brackets under the overhanging section of a *cornice*.

oriel window Multi-sided window that projects from a wall and whose base does not reach the ground.

Palladian window Three part window consisting of a round-headed window flanked by two shorter and narrower windows, each part usually being framed by *pilasters* or *columns*.

pavilion with ells plan House form consisting of a main block, generally with a gable front, and flanking matching *ells*.

pediment The triangular wall area inside a gable and framed by *cornices* along all three sides. Also used to mean cornice-framed elements, either triangular or other shapes, found over doors or windows.

pilaster Flat representation of a *column*.

quoins Blocks of stone or other materials found at the corners of buildings. Usually arranged in an alternating pattern of large and small blocks.

raking window Gable end window set at an angle between the roof lines of the main house block and its *wing*.

shed roof Roof with a single slope.



sidehall plan House form with a gable front and main door (leading into a hallway) in the left or right hand bay.

sidelights Narrow vertical windows, usually consisting of small panes or patterned leaded glass, flanking a door.

surround The frame and trim surrounding the sides and top of a door or window.

three-quarter plan house A *Cape Cod*, *Classic Cottage*, *Georgian plan*, or *I-house* four bays wide across the eaves side with a window on one side of the door and two on the other.

transom Row of glass panes located directly above a door.

Tri-Gable Ell Gable front house with an *ell* almost the same height as the main block. Built in late 1800s and early 1900s.

vernacular Having few of the elements or ornamental details characterizing a particular architectural style.

STYLE GUIDE



BUNGALOW

The word *bungalow* comes from India where, in the late 19th century, the British used it to describe low, single-story houses with large verandas well-suited to tropical environments. American bungalows, “homey” early 20th century 1 or 1½ story residences, have broad gable, hip, or jerkinhead roofs, often with dormer windows and deep overhanging eaves, and deep, wide front porches.



COLONIAL REVIVAL

The Colonial Revival style, popular from the late 1800s through the 1930s (and still used today), was derived from American architectural styles of the 18th century. Houses (traditional Georgian, sidehall, or other plans with gable, gambrel, or hip roofs), commercial blocks, and public buildings are decorated with features derived from the earlier styles but distinguishable by their larger scale and often unusual placement on the building. Among the most typical details are Palladian windows, porches with classical columns, doorways topped by fanlights or pediments, and full entablatures under the eaves.



FEDERAL

The Federal style, with its light and delicate detailing inspired by the classical architecture of ancient Rome, was the first major style in Vermont. It was widely used from the late 1700s through the 1830s to

trim churches and the symmetrical gable, hip, or gambrel roof Georgian plan, I-house, or Cape Cod houses of the period. The main stylistic focus is on the entryway: a paneled door often flanked by sidelights and thin columns or pilasters, and crowned by a semi-elliptical fan or fanlight, transom, or delicate entablature. Other features include Palladian windows and molded cornices or entablatures that are sometimes enriched with dentils or fretwork.



FRENCH SECOND EMPIRE

Popular in Vermont during the 1870s and 1880s, the elegant French Second Empire style, used for residences, public buildings, and commercial blocks, is character-

ized by use of the Mansard roof. Other features, shared with the Italianate style, include eavesline brackets, paired windows, and sweeping verandas with chamfered posts and matching brackets.



GOTHIC REVIVAL

The Gothic Revival style was first used in Vermont from the 1820s to 1840s for churches, which were built in the common New England meetinghouse form but with pinnacles and cresting atop belfry

towers and pointed arch windows with diamond panes. Churches from the 1850s to 1870s have the same features but often were built of stone. Houses in the style, irregular in form or symmetrical Classic Cottages built in the 1850s and 1860s, have steeply pitched roofs and wall dormers edged with bargeboards, molded label lintels over windows and doors, and porches with octagonal posts.



GREEK REVIVAL

Inspired by the ancient architecture of Greece, the Greek Revival style was the most popular 19th century style in Vermont, in widespread use from the 1830s through the 1870s, and later in remote rural

areas. Residences (often sidehalls, Georgian plans, or Classic Cottages), churches, courthouses, stores, and other buildings are detailed with pilasters, full entablatures, and pediments. Most of the stylistic emphasis is often on the main entry—a paneled door flanked by sidelights and robust columns or pilasters, and topped by a transom and three part entablature.



ITALIANATE

The Italianate style, influenced by the architecture of Italian countryside villas, became popular in Vermont after the Civil War and was used mainly for houses, commercial blocks, and outbuildings.

Houses are either cube-shaped, with shallow hip roofs and sometimes projecting pavilions or towers, or gable-roofed Georgian or sidehall plans. Features include cornice brackets under overhanging eaves, rooftop cupolas or belvederes, windows that are often paired with arched tops, and porches with chamfered posts and scrolled brackets.



QUEEN ANNE


Gaudy, colorful, and irregular describe the Queen Anne style, popular in Vermont from about 1885 to 1905 for churches, public buildings, commercial blocks, and particularly

for houses. It is identified by its asymmetrical building forms, richly textured wall surfaces, multi-colored paint schemes, unpredictable window spacing, towers, bay windows, gable screens, and porches with turned columns and balusters.



The Gale-Deering house is a fine example of the stone architecture that achieved great popularity in Addison County during the early nineteenth century. It is the only such house in Bridport and is distinguished by the wide variety of stone used in its construction.


The farm complex is an interesting collection of specific function barns and outbuildings. It is typical of the type of agricultural complex that has been the traditional backbone of the Bridport social and economic life.

The house was built in 1842-46 for George Gale, son of John Gale. The elder Gale was one of Bridport's early settlers arriving sometime between 1790 and 1800. The farm passed into other hands during the nineteenth century.



This is one of the finer Italianate houses in Addison County. Little cost was spared by its builders in detailing and elaboration. It is particularly noteworthy for the presence of an elaborate belvedere on the roof. This house may have been the work of the same builder responsible for the Belle Vue house on the west side of town. (0102-15)

The house was built by John T Lamos, a carpenter who came to Bridport from New Hampshire around 1860. The site was originally cleared as the Benjamin lot, probably by descendents of Samuel Benjamin who was one of the first settlers to return to Bridport after the Revolutionary War.






This transitional brick house has some interesting details that were common to the building vocabulary of this part of Addison County. Particularly noteworthy is the semi-circular fanlight with ornamental starbursts. Similar elements are found on other houses in Bridport, Weybridge and Middlebury. It is a motif used in some of the domestic designs of Middlebury architect Lavius Fillmore (1767-1852)

The house was probably built for one of the descendants of David Pratt, a carpenter who moved to Bridport in 1777 from Salem, Mass. Pratt first settled on land owned by Wayne Carr. (0102-40)


This house is an interesting example of "built-on" vernacular architecture. There are enough outbuildings to merit complex classification but most of them will soon be torn down. (see map)

This land was first cleared and settled as part of the lakeshore plot owned by Bridport's permanent settler, Samuel Smith. During the early nineteenth century, the Smith's were the largest family in Bridport and they played active roles in town leadership. Isaac Smith seems to have been the man who built this house. After the middle of the nineteenth century the Smith's sold the house out of the family to a Dr. Blanchard who moved to town in 1862.



The house and farming complex may have been built by a descendent of Jakamiah Johnson who settled in Bridport from New Jersey in 1794. A Johnson lived there in 1871.



The house was built for Henry E. Merrill, a descendent of Ebenezer Merrill who came to Addison from West Hartford, Conn. during the 1780's





STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

During the nineteenth century this was an important commercial center for Bridport. Ferries travelled between here and Crown Point for almost 100 years. The earliest ferry was begun in 1811 by John Rogers. At the time the store was finished in 1883 the site was known as Brooks Ferry. The store is an important early example of rural commercial architecture and is important, as a document of the commercial history of Lake Champlain.



The house was built by Solomon Lapham who came across to Bridport from New York around 1800. His descendents made their fortunes on this plot as turkey farmers





This gable end-on house is typical of the early Greek Revival with simple but heavy molded frontispiece; wide raking entablature; gable returns; glowered pedimental fanlight and 6 over 6 window sash. Both front and side doors have six recessed panels. The back ell looks architectural definition but probably dates to the late mid or nineteenth century. There is a later side porch and wing.

The house was built for James Fletcher who moved to Bridport from Woodstock, Vermont around 1810. He spent his life farming and engaged in the saddle and harness-making business. His brother Paris Fletcher rose to become one of Addison County's most illustrious citizens.

This once fine Federal mansion has an elaborate cornice with classical moldings and square guttae blocks. Marble lintels and window sills; marble supporting arched lintel above the frontispiece which has attenuated pilasters; sidelights over side panels, and a louvered fan. About half of the original 6 over 6 windows are intact. Gable returns; louvered quarter-circular paired pedimental fanlight.

Interior is a basic 4 over 4 room plan with center hall and end chimneys. Attached wing has a gable roof, clapboard siding and was built later.


Architecturally, this is one of the finest brick houses in Bridport. Dating to the late-Federal periods it represents many of the motifs that are commonly associated with that style in rural areas.

The house was probably built for Henry Bagley who bought the land in 1800. In 1919 the house was sold to the Bridport Cooperative Dairy Company and has since been known as the cheese factory house.

Georgian: Projecting, central, pedimented bay; Palladian window with fluted pilasters, muntin interlace and fluted keystone

Federal: Delicate cornice moldings; gable returns; elaborate frontispiece (of similar design with the Palladian window) with tiny brackets; molded window casings

Greek Revival: Sidelight delineation panelled door; Asher Benjamin inspired bastardized Greek key in the recessed panels of the frontispiece

House has paired chimneys and an attached shed on the back. Also a modern attached 2 car garage, which is the perfect complement to the aluminum siding.


STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is a tragic case for Bridport. This surveyor thinks it or the Paris Fletcher store are the most important buildings in town. The present owners have made some ludicrous alterations which most likely will deny the house its natural role as a focal point in Bridport's architectural and cultural history. More than an excellent example of c. 1800 architecture, it has traditionally served the town's changing community needs. The house was probably built for Samuel Buck around 1803. For a number of years Buck used this and other structures to house his numerous commercial activities. He became wealthy at middle-age, owning large commercial interests. He settled in Bridport in 1790. The house was later owned by Paris Fletcher, who ran a boarding house there. It was later called the Grand View Inn.


STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

The Bridport Historic District is historically significant as the center of Bridport's social, economic and political life. The township of Bridport was chartered October 10th, 1761 but it was not formally organized until after the Revolutionary War. When organized in 1884, a common green was laid out and the area around it, of which this district is comprised, was made the formal town center. It remains the center of religious, political and commercial activity to the present. By the middle of the nineteenth century there was a school, a church, a cemetery, a hotel, a cobbler's shop, a wheelwright, a blacksmith, a cabinetmaker's shop and a store; the latter remains the most recognized architectural landmark in Bridport. This building, which was built as a store for Paris Fletcher, bears such a distinct visual relation to the majority of brick buildings in Fletcher's home town of Woodstock Vermont that it might reasonably be said to represent the builder's attempt to bring the high culture of Woodstock with him and thus enrich the relatively provincial Champlain Valley Town.






STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Though the house is of little architectural significance, this is probably the finest collection of working specific-purpose out-buildings in Bridport. This is enhanced by the site of the complex which is nothing short of picturesque. Though it is still actively farmed, it is easy to visualize a greater activity here during the late nineteenth century when the tenant house was occupied as well.

The house and property were probably developed by Abel H. Rice during the middle of the nineteenth century. The property and another house, long gone, were the residence of 3 generations of Rices before Abel H. rebuilt much of the present complex during the 1870's and 1880's.




ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL OR STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION

This 5 by 2 bay late Federal farmhouse has been much altered since it was first constructed. Bays and porches have been added; floor plans have been changed and newer wide paned window sashes installed. But the roofline remains as built with a molded cornice and gable returns. The frontispiece is grandly panelled with attenuated, fluted pilasters with full entablature and sidelights.

A trailing ell off the back could be older than the main house but significant alterations leave it hard to date.




ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL OR STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION

The architectural integrity of this house has been seriously compromised in the past few years. Floors have been rearranged and covered with hardwood maple laid across the old wide pine; mantelpieces have been removed and broken apart; the fenestration and doors have been modernized and the whole building sheathed in aluminum siding. The south doorway (enclosed by the porch) massing, hip-roof and original palladian window are the only apparent original features. The Palladian window has fluted pilasters, keystone arch and a denticulated entablature.

Large collection of modern barns, mostly aluminum sided, all painted sea-blue (Not detailed on map)


Though little original fabric remains, fragments in the barn, a trace of molding and the aluminum-surrounded palladian window suggest that this may have been as fine a house as Bridport had yet seen at the time of its completion.

The house was probably built for a member of the Gray family, probably Robert. He was the son of Lamond Gray, one of Bridport's earliest settlers.

This house was built in many parts. The formal front is a 3 by 2 bay brick end on with a fully articulated molded gable with peaked window lintel. The gable is made of wood. Large stone lintels and sills. Frontispiece is simple with sidelights, transom, and glazed corner blocks recessed behind panelled sides and cased within a massive post and lintel support system. 6 over 6 windows. Attached wing dates to the same time as the main mass and also has a fully pedimented gable. 2 section, 1 1/2-story asphalt shingled wings continue back on the property and may have originally been houses.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is a most unusual vernacular interpretation of the Greek Revival and is a visual landmark in Bridport. The mixture of wood and brick suggests that possibly this house was finished with parts of separate buildings.

David Pratt came to Bridport from Salem, Mass. in 1777. He was a carpenter and was the first man to settle this site. He probably built the earlier ell. His son Orin W. Pratt probably built the present house.




Though a modest farmhouse, this structure shows remarkable growth and change in its three separate sections. It is most noteworthy for its fine state of preservation. The present owners have taken pains to maintain the historic and architectural integrity of the exterior. The barns and outbuildings are important in maintaining an appropriate historic and economic context for the house.

The house was built for Micheal Hamilton who settled from Barre, Mass. around 1795. He was one of three brothers who settled Bridport at that time (see 0102-47 and 0102-48). In a manner typical of early settling clans, they staked out adjoining plots.





STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE



This structure appears to have originally been a hewn log lap-jointed dwelling. It was more recently converted to a barn with a shed attached to the west. Recently it was burned out. Although the timbers are substantially solid, two walls are leaning and threatening to collapse. Bricks, perhaps the remains of chimney on north side. Logs removed from opening into attached shed may have been used to fill in former chimney location. Appears to have had no cellar. Walls 10 logs high. Logs are hewn to 6 1/2" thickness and 8-15" broad. Doors and older windows were chopped out; * (Continued Below)


RELATED STRUCTURES

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This appears to have been an early hewn log structure. Its chopped out (not sawn) windows and doors with pegged frames mark it as primitive and possibly from the early settlement era. The large size of the hewn timbers also supports this hypothesis. Although used as a barn until it was burned out recently, Leo Huestis, a farmer who rents the surrounding land, has been told by older Bridport residents that it was formerly a dwelling. Date is unknown.


