This house has been repackaged almost beyond recognition. Thick ivy-covered stucco walls belie its original Greek Revival character. Also a 20th century entrance porch hides the best clue - a fine frontispiece with very wide entablature and Asher Benjamin inspired convex frieze panel. Pilasters were removed for stucco, but there remains a 15 glazed panel transom and a 7-panel door. The porch is of a type common to Bristol with exposed rafter ends, shingle base and scroll corner brackets. Molded cornice and frieze with end returns. Attached 1-1/2 story gable, clapboard ell. Side enclosed porch.

RELATED STRUCTURES: (Describe)

1. Two-level barn, gable roof, clapboard siding, sliding door, asphalt shingle roofing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

A modest example of the Greek Revival style. It is interesting for its present form bears little relation to what the original building would have looked like. A very fine frontispiece remains, but the rest of the house has been covered with stucco.

The house was built for a man named Brown, possibly a son of Richard Brown, who settled in Bristol from Pittsford, Massachusetts in 1809.


